Aug 30 Back to School Night – Open House

Parents help with directing new students and parents, answering questions, school tours. And, you can get your car washed while you are inside, for a small donation benefiting Leadership.

Oct 12 Junior Interviews

Parents interview and provide feedback to our juniors in their mock job interviews. A summary of topic questions and a general overview of what is expected and should be addressed will be provided.
